The Te Pataka Kai Christmas Food Drive

Help Te Pataka Kai make Christmas special for its community by making a donation to its Christmas foodrive for Christmas hampers over the holidays.

Te Pataka Kai (TPK) 4412 is a safe and friendly space for whanau to come and get kai with no questions asked or no criteria to meet. Best Care (Whakapai Hauora) Charitable Trust is working with other Manawatū partners to provide kai within the community and feeds up to 300 whanau per week. Manawatū Food Action Network currently coordinates the māra kai at Whakapai Hauora, harvesting veges weekly for supply to TPK and working with rangatahi on the Youth Justice Programme. Staff members and their whānau have also been involved helping with gardening tasks.

Exciting funding opportunity for local environmental initiatives.

ENM administers the Environmental Initiatives Fund to support Palmerston North-based community initiatives that improve environmental outcomes. Small Grants (up to \$1000) and Large Grants (between \$1,000 and \$12,000) are available for projects that align with PNCC's Eco-City Strategy priorities (as financer of the fund), and any identified priorities of the network. The Small Grants are open year-round for applications, and Large Grants have one funding round a year, next opening in February 2022. There is currently \$66,000 available for distribution.
